ART NEWS: Mrs. Conversano

Remote learning in art class means we have the opportunity for unlimited creativity. Every drawing begins with a pencil and a new sheet of white paper. Students are adding color to their drawings with their choice of crayons, markers, colored pencils, or watercolors. In kindergarten through second grade, students have been learning about elements of art: line, shape, and color. First, we explored different types of lines and how lines come together to make shapes. Then students completed their drawings by coloring or painting the shapes they drew. Our students have created autumn-themed drawings such as an autumn owl and a cute candy corn. Third through sixth grade students have begun the school year by creating their own personal message in Positive Graffiti Art. We began with a discussion of what constitutes art and how art can be used as a form of communication. Each student chose a positive word or phrase that has meaning to them. Students are using the elements of line, shape, and color to create their positive messages.

Music class, like so many things, is looking a bit different this year but Grant School students are rising to the challenge! Lower grades have been singing along with Melody the Elephant while reinforcing skills like keeping a steady beat, using their singing voice, and making notes high or low. Middle grades are learning new ways to count rhythms and remembering how to read pitches in preparation for playing instruments in the future. Upper grades have been doing some of the same, along with learning about "Space Age" music by composer Juan Esquivel, with some classes even getting the opportunity to create their own music using sites like Chrome Music Lab and Incredibox. Until we can make music in person together again, we are making the best of *virtually* everything in Music class!

ESL NEWS: Mrs.Smith

Welcome to a new and interesting year for ESL at Grant School! ESL classes concentrate on reading, writing, speaking and listening exercises to provide a variety of opportunities to learn English. In the Kindergarten class, we study a new letter every week. This includes singing a song for the letter, writing upper and lowercase letters, and drawing vocabulary words that begin with that letter. First grade works on five new sight words every week, and concentrates on learning short vowel sounds. Students read stories and sing songs that include short vowel words. Second grade is studying the thematic unit of planting seeds. The upper elementary grades are learning about animal skeletons. Both units of study include an opportunity to read a variety of materials, use technology, and incorporate subjects like math, science and social studies to learn more about a topic.
