Wow! Can you believe we have started the second trimester already? We are so excited to see your children each morning and are grateful for the routine that we have been able to create with them. We appreciate your continued efforts and support in making sure they have an appropriate space at home to learn from, we see the difference it makes for the students. In that light, please continue to make sure that they are dressed and have finished eating prior to the start of the school day so they are ready to focus.

We spent the first trimester on reviewing a lot of skills in our core subject areas. In math, we will be expanding on our knowledge of addition and subtraction as we begin Topic 5. Students should be practicing facts to 20, including thinking about related facts, to help them prepare for this continued learning, In language arts, we have been adding long vowels, consonant blends, and digraphs to our foundational knowledge of short vowels and consonants. We continue to learn sight words, using them in our reading and writing.

Our social studies lessons have been focusing on the themes of government, outlining our important documents, teaching us about our important patriotic symbols and holidays, and introducing us to the founders of our country. In our science lessons, we have learned the difference between living and non-living things. We know the important characteristics of living things, are able to describe a life cycle, and are learning about survival behaviors animals need for different habitats.

Homework and afternoon assignments are released in Google Classroom daily; please make sure students are doing them, turning them in, and attaching their work. Watch for Reading Groups, Extra Help, or other interactive learning as well in the afternoons. Students should be reading daily, along with practicing addition and subtraction facts. Happy Holidays! Second Graders are in the holiday spirit! We started a Gingerbread unit by learning the history of Gingerbread.
