Welcome back to school! We are so excited to meet our new 1st grade friends. The children are learning all the routines to make them successful students. Please maintain routines at home, especially for homework, bedtime, breakfast, and getting ready for school. In Math, we will be reviewing basic addition and subtraction. We will be learning and practicing ways to write and solve equations to 10. In ELA, we are learning about the habits that good readers and writers have. Students will be practicing the sounds letters make and putting those together to sound out words in books or as we write. Learning sight words (also called high frequency words) is another big key to reading and writing. We will be reviewing lists of sight words that are familiar from kindergarten and building a list of new first grade sight words throughout the year. In Social Studies, we will be learning about communities, including our classroom and school. We are spending time adjusting to our class and school communities by learning about each other, our rules, and how to work together. At home, each student should be reading daily and practicing addition and subtraction facts. If you have specific concerns about your student, please reach out directly to your child's homeroom teacher. We will be sending home additional information for connecting with teachers and apps to use to practice on; keep an eye on your email and your student's Google Classroom. Remember, we are here to help!
