#### FIRST GRADE NEWS: Mrs. Kelly & Ms. Walker

October has brought us cooler weather, falling leaves, and lots of excitement for learning. At school, our theme of the month is Respect. We are celebrated with themes during the Week of Respect. We are learning what respect means, how it looks, and what it feels like when we are treated respectfully. In math, we continue to review basic addition and subtraction. We have been learning and practicing strategies to solve equations to 10. We are expanding this knowledge by working on addition facts to twenty. In ELA, we have been enjoying hearing stories as we explore the themes of community, rhyming, friendship, and family. Students are reviewing sight words and word families; these are a key to both reading and writing. In social studies we are learning about communities, rules, laws, and government. Our series, Studies Weekly, outlines the basic structure of democracy, along with helping us to understand the vocabulary we need to understand in the world around us. In science, we are noticing the patterns that exist around us that come from the sun, moon, and the Earth, and their movements. We see how this affects our weather and seasons. At home, students should be reading (and logging) daily, along with practicing their addition and subtraction facts.
