Can you believe we are almost at the 100th day of school? February is bringing some fun celebrations as we prepare for Valentine's Day and the 100th Day. We love the opportunities and enthusiasm these present for learning through new experiences. We appreciate your continued efforts in making time to meet with us during conferences, to make sure our students have appropriate support at home, and to encourage students to be their best: the difference it makes for our students shows! In math, we are beginning Topic 8-Understand Place Value. We have learned to count to 120 and beyond, not only by 1s but also 5s and 10s. We can count by 10s and then by 1s. We are understanding the place a digit is within a numeral. We work regularly on our basic addition and subtraction facts to 20. In ELA, we have been working on writing multiple sentences. This requires continued practice of many skills-coming up with an idea, use of sight words, sounding out words, using our spelling words, and handwriting. Please continue to practice this at home by telling and writing stories. We are loving our daily read alouds and have had with the themes. Nonfiction Animals and Humor have been recent favorites. In our social studies series, we are exploring the 5 themes of geography. In science, we are learning about living things. Homework is released in Google Classroom daily. Students should be reading daily, along with practicing addition and subtraction facts. Please work on independence in preparing to go outside (putting on and zipping coats, hats, and gloves/mittens) to help ensure a smooth dismissal process in the colder weather.
