#### **FOURTH GRADE NEWS: Ms. Mastellone**

Fourth grade mathematicians are studying units of measurement, both customary and metric, for length, weight, and volume. Students are learning how to convert between different units of measurement to find equivalent measures. Ask your child the trick they learned to be able to change measurements from large units to small units and from small units to large units (Hint: big to small multiply, small to big divide). In science, we are continuing our physical science unit of matter and energy. We already explored thermal energy and are currently experimenting with light and sound. Social studies over the past several weeks have been so entertaining. The children researched many American inventors, wrote a research project on an inventor, created a paper doll of the inventor, and gave an oral presentation about what they learned.

Fourth grade readers and writers are working hard to prepare for the NJSLA and to get ready for fifth grade! We are practicing writing 'Compare and Contrast' style essays in which we pair two texts on a similar topic.
