SMALL GROUP: Mrs. Conversano, Ms. Raimo & Dr. Steele

Dr. Steele's sixth graders just completed a unit on volume. Students enjoyed building rectangular prisms with wooden unit cubes before learning to use a formula to solve for volume. Next, they had to find a missing side and solved word problems using either cubes or the formula. Students in Mrs. Conversano's mixed grade, small-group math class have been learning to interpret data using picture graphs and bar graphs. Mrs. Conversano's fifth grade math students have been using the IXL Diagnostic Action Plan to build individual math skills. Children in Ms. Raimo's ELA classes are creating genre stories with 'StoryBoard That'. This project is giving students the opportunity to let their creativity shine as they think of the design of their chosen genre. 'StoryBoard That' provides simple and clever visual tools for students to focus on the Four Cs (Critical Thinking, Creativity, Communication, and Collaboration) in order to help improve their thinking capabilities and potential.
