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SECOND GRADE NEWS: Mrs. Dinkjian and Mrs. Spina

During the past few weeks, the second graders have been working on independent research projects. They were given the opportunity to choose an animal they were interested in learning more about, then research that animal. The students used their research and newly found knowledge to write a factual book about the animal. The students' books include all the parts of an informational book including a table of contents; chapters on each of the following: habitat, diet in the wild and in captivity, life cycle of the animal, interesting facts about the animal, a glossary of terms, and a short autobiography by the author, as well as original artwork by the student authors. The students had fun finding information and sharing what they learned. If your child is a second grader, ask them to teach you about the animal they researched. If your child isn't a second grader, the second graders hope to share their knowledge with other students after state testing is concluded.
